- Save, retrieve, and reuse searches in journal databases
- Create search and journal alerts in databases



Creating an Account in a Database


Creating a personal account in a database allows you to:

- Save articles to folders
- Save and reuse searches
- Create and manage search and journal alerts




Creating an Account: ScienceDirect

In most databases, there is a button at the top of the page to sign in or register. This is how the options appear in the database ScienceDirect, below.



How to Create an Account

After selecting Registration, you will be prompted to enter your email address. If given the option, use your SMU email address to ensure complete access.



Saving Searches and Creating Search Alerts


You can run your saved searches at any time. You can also combine saved searches with other searches.

A search alert will run a saved search at a specific time interval of your choosing and email the results to the email address used for your account.



Saving Searches: ABI/INFORM

In the database ABI/INFORM, there is a box to the top right of the search results page called “Save search/alert”. This allows you to name your saved search and set time intervals for the search to be run automatically.

Saved Searches Page: ABI/INFORM

You can access your saved searches at any time. In ABI/INFORM, **Saved searches** is found under the person icon in the top right corner. Other databases may use different icons or words.



Journal Alerts

Journal alerts will notify you when a new issue or volume is added to the database. Like search alerts, you will be notified through the email that is attached to your account.



Setting up Journal Alerts

When viewing a journal, look for a button that says, “Create Journal Alert” (or a similar phrase), such as this example from Gale Academic OneFile.



Gale Academic OneFile: Journal Alert
