



Dr Annick MacAskill

Annick MacAskill is an Assistant Professor (limited term) of French in the Department of Languages and Cultures at Saint Mary's University. She holds a PhD in French Literature from Western University, where she completed a thesis on the sixteenth-century French poet and translator Anne de Marquets (1533?- 1588).

Her scholarly interests include the poetry of France's religious wars (1562-98); writing by French women from the Medieval period and

throughout the Ancien Régime; feminist theory; queer theory; and translation studies.

MacAskill also has a background in creative writing. Her poetry has appeared widely in literary journals across Canada and abroad and in the *Best Canadian Poetry* anthology series. She is the author of three full-length poetry collections, all published with Gaspereau Press. Her latest book, *Shadow Blight*, won the 2022 Governor General's Award for Poetry. Her fourth book, *Votive*, will be published in the fall of 2024.

She combines her scholarly and creative interests in her most recent projects: an English-language translation of Anne de Marquets' *Sonets de l'amour divin*, a suite of forty devotional sonnets first published in 1568; and a book of poetry about a case of supposed demonic possessions in an Ursuline convent in Loudun, France, in the early seventeenth century.
