


Overview


- New Brunswick has 25 Designated Learning Institutions (DLIs)

 - Six Private Universities and other private postsecondary learning institutions accredited by third parties.

International Student Enrolment



The New Brunswick Designation Policy for Institutions Hosting International Students

- The Policy governs as the eligibility of all New Brunswick's post-secondary learning institutions to be designated by the Province for the purpose of hosting international students requiring a visa to attend a program of study in Canada.
- The policy is a mechanism for designating New Brunswick's post-secondary learning institutions under the International Student Program; and
- To establish respective responsibilities for the Province and designated learning institutions for the effective undertaking of this Policy.





International Student Policy What are the main changes?

- Clarity to the criteria for designation:
 - Enhancements to required policies & procedures;
 - Details on essential services & supports;
 - Clear process for application requirements;
 - Enhanced financial requirements.
- Clarification required reporting & student record retention
- Specific requirements for institution ownership changes
- Streamline process for revocation procedures

What are the expected results?

- To add clarity for stakeholders;
- Additional student protection;
- Transparency from DLIs;
- To improve student service offering for international students;
- To improve services for domestic students as a byproduct;
- Consistency of student service offerings from DLIs.
