

Please know how proud we are—of you and your accomplishments! Convocation is a special time, a time for thanks, reflection and, above all, celebration!



THE CEREMONIAL MACE

The ceremonial mace, carried by the Marshal of Convocation, was presented to Saint Mary's University in 1980. It symbolizes the University's authority to grant degrees and is a gift from Maritime Command in honour of alumni killed in both world wars. The mace also recognizes serving members of the Canadian Armed Forces who have been students at Saint Mary's.

The mace is made of oak with a cast brass crown and brass plates carrying traditional ceremonial engravings; the plates represent the contributions to Saint Mary's by the Jesuit Fathers, the Christian Brothers of Ireland, the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Halifax-Yarmouth, the LaSalle Christian Brothers, the Lay Teachers and the Armed Forces.

Flags on the Stage



The flags which you see displayed on the stage

for Convocation are from the countries representing our graduating students. The globalization of the Saint Mary's University community is a feature of justifiable pride which contributes markedly to the growth and understanding of both Canadian and non-Canadian students.

Included in the University's permanent collection of flags is one from the International Year of the Disabled signifying the University's commitment to people with disabilities. The Mi'kmaq flag is an important part of this collection in recognition of their First Nation's Status. The University's Bicentennial flag was made a part of our permanent collection in 2002.



Academic Hoods

Graduates and members of the academic procession are attired in the basic elements of formal academic dress, which follow general guidelines established at England's Oxford and Cambridge Universities. It consists of the academic robe, hood and mortar board (at Saint Mary's, the latter is limited to Master's graduates).

The academic hood symbolizes the degree into which each graduate has been admitted, its outer edge trimmed with a color to indicate a particular Faculty and degree: white symbolizes Arts; gold, Science; grey, Commerce, and green for Environmental Studies. Bachelor-level hoods are lined with satin in the colours of the institution granting the degree. Hence at Saint Mary's, they are maroon satin with a white chevron. The Master's hood is lined with maroon satin only, giving it added distinction.

Professor Emerita

Patricia Bradshaw



Pat Bradshaw completed her term as Dean of the Sobey School of Business at Saint Mary's University in May of 2018 and retired September 1, 2022, from her position as a Professor of Management. As Dean, she was responsible for building consensus around a compelling mission for the school and establishing strategic priorities to ensure 80 full time faculty, 3200 students, key donors, community leaders and over 20,000 alumni felt aligned with the School's direction.

With an annual economic contribution to the province of Nova Scotia of over \$329 million by this AACSB accredited School, her position was focused on creating impact with purpose and ensuring that resources of the School were mobilized to help build prosperity in the province.

Previously, Pat was an Organizational Behaviour Professor at the Schulich School of Business, York University and held roles such as the Chair of the University Senate, Treasurer of the faculty union and Chair of the Organization Studies Area. Her research interests include governance of non-profit organizations, change management and organizational power and politics from an intersectional feminist and social justice lens.

Pat is currently on the board of Feed Nova Scotia and has been on the Board of the Atlantic Provinces Economic Council as well as being Chair of the Board of the Community Sector Council of Nova Scotia. She was one of the founding co-chairs of the Nova Scotia Nonprofit COVID-19 Coalition.

She is currently active as a consultant and facilitator in the areas of strategic planning and non-profit governance.



Father William A. Stewart, SJ Medal for Excellence in Teaching

Mary Sheppard, Senior Lecturer Chemistry



Mary Sheppard is a Senior Lecturer in the Department of Chemistry. Graduating with a Bachelor of Science degree from Memorial University in 1999, Mary then completed her graduate studies in analytical chemistry at the University of Alberta where she developed novel separation techniques using zwitterions in capillary electrophoresis. After teaching at five universities across Canada and a brief time working as a research analytical chemist, she returned to her love of teaching and became a lecturer at Saint Mary's University in 2002.

Born and raised in the tiny town of Taylor's Bay, Newfoundland and being a first-generation university graduate, Prof. Sheppard personally understands the challenging transition to university learning. Enhancing student success has been a central driving force of her work. As part of her support to students' transition to university, she sends them welcome emails and FAQ sheets. Prof. Sheppard introduced cocurricular Student Success modules in first-year chemistry laboratory. She is also an early adopter of the Early Assist program that supports students if they face challenges that impact their academic success.

After over 15 years of teaching, Prof. Sheppard's growing interest in how students learn led her back to graduate school to pursue a doctoral degree in chemistry education research at the University of New Hampshire (degree to be conferred on May 19, 2023). Simultaneously completing a PhD degree and teaching full-time was challenging, but also advantageous since teaching and education research are fundamentally entwined. Her research uses qualitative interview methods to explore how students develop understanding of chemistry topics. Results inform the development of more effective teaching strategies to mitigate learning challenges.

Prof. Sheppard brings her insight about chemistry education best practice to her classrooms. She developed guided inquiry experiments and student-led demonstrations for chemistry laboratory to enhance first-year students' critical thinking and communication skills. Her third-year environmental chemistry course, a noted favourite of students, examines recent peer-reviewed literature to develop scientific writing and communication. Prof. Sheppard is devoted to students' success and grateful for the privilege of being involved in the learning journey of many wonderful students.



Honorary Degree Recipient

Bob Dawson

Bob Dawson BA'71 is a leader in the fight against racism, both on and off the ice.

Born in Dartmouth, NS, Bob attended Saint Mary's in 1967. He became the first Black player in the former Atlantic Intercollegiate Hockey League, where he was often the target of racial slurs and abuse. In 1970, he made history with teammates Darrell Maxwell and Percy Paris as the first all-Black line in Canadian university hockey.



After completing his Masters in Social Work in 1973 at Dalhousie University, Bob joined the federal Public Service of Canada where he worked for 37 years in human resources management, garnering awards for his contributions to employment equity and diversity.


Bob has worked with numerous community groups, organizations and law enforcement to address racism. As a member of the Ottawa-Carleton Area Police Community Council, he helped develop a strategy to prevent, manage and resolve critical incidents involving the police and communities of colour. While with the National Capital Alliance on Race Relations, he established and implemented the Police-Minority Youth Program and was recognized with a Civilian Citation and Community Service Award by Police Services Boards of Gloucester and Ottawa.

One of Bob's proudest moments came when his request to Canada Post for a stamp to commemorate the "125th anniversary of the Colored Hockey League of the Maritimes (CHLM)" was approved and issued on January 24, 2020.

An accomplished sportswriter and historian, Bob writes extensively on Blacks in various sports, especially hockey. In 2022, The Hockey News recognized him as one of the Social Change Advocates Making An Impact for his work in the areas of anti-racism, diversity, equity and inclusion.

On February 22, 2022, the NHL's Ottawa Senators presented Bob with a team jersey in recognition of his contributions to growing the game of hockey in Ottawa. At the Carnegie Initiative Summit in January 2023 in Toronto, he was presented with the Carnegie Initiative Lifetime Achievement Award for his commitment to challenging the status quo to make hockey more inclusive.

His thirst for knowledge and desire to broaden his horizons brought him to Saint Mary's University, where he enrolled in the Master of Technology Entrepreneurship and Innovation program.
